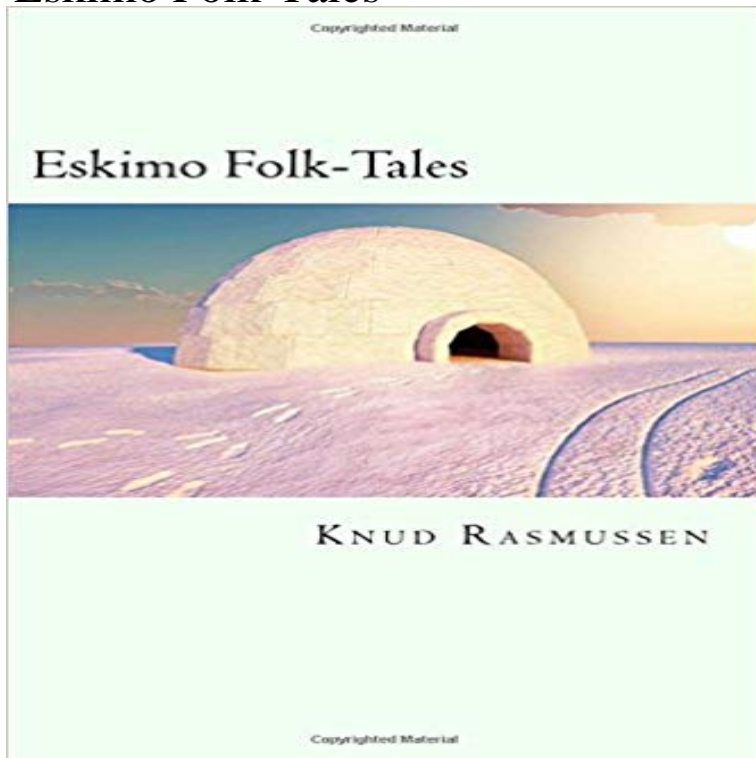


Eskimo Folk-Tales



Knud Rasmussen's work bears witness to a more profound understanding of, and deeper penetration into, Eskimo mentality. Thus he opened new roads to comparative Eskimo research. In his research Knud Rasmussen was always endeavoring to give expression to his individual sense of realities. His translations were bound to bear the stamp of his personal style of writing. His aim was to be realistic and at the same time to be in the closest possible contact with the Eskimo train of thought. In order to initiate the spirit, tone, and imagination of Eskimo poems and legends he had to exorcize his Eskimo soul and turn European.
