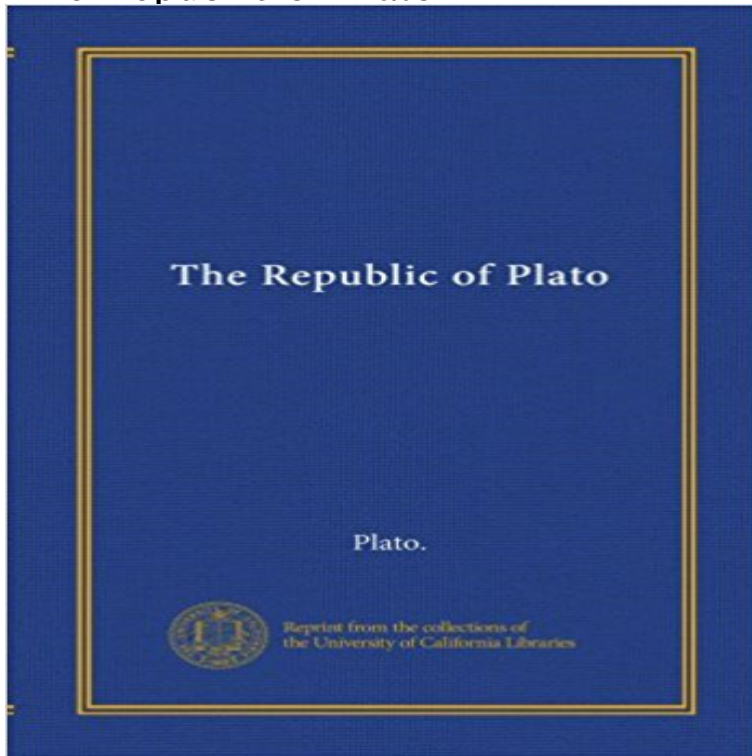


The Republic of Plato
